## NAPLAN

Once again, our year 3 and 5 students will be completing NAPLAN tests. Please ensure children get plenty of sleep during this week so they can remain focussed during the tests.

### PRIMARY EXCURSION

As a result of the survey sent to primary parents last term, our school will be participating in the Victorian Excursion at the end of Term 3. Confirmation of dates and itinerary will be sent home once it has been finalised by the organising school. Once this is done, I will ask for a deposit of \$100 to secure your child's place on the excursion. At this stage there are more students than places. The deposit will not be refundable unless there is a medical certificate indicating illness. In the past, the school has been left with a large account because people changed their mind about attending after we had committed numbers. I don't want this to happen again.

### Musica Viva Makukuhan

### Indonesian Gamelan

I have accepted an invitation to attend Makukuhan in Canowindra on May 24<sup>th</sup>. Cost of entry will be \$6.50 per child. Bus travel will be fully subsidised. It is not often we get the opportunity for such a multicultural experience.

Makukuhan is a dynamic mini-Gamelan orchestra, whose performances are a riot of colour and rhythm, including pitch-bending drums, a mesmerising masked dance and unbelievably rapid Javanese clapping. Gamelan features a series of bronze gongs and metallaphones and is integral to Indonesian culture. Students will be captivated by the pattern-based sequences that have made the Gamelan one of the world's most influential musical exports of the 20th century.

#### MATHS HELP FOR FAMILIES

I thought some of the following tips might be very helpful if your child is experiencing any frustrations or anxiety with Mathematics. We need to remember that everyone learns at a different rate and the "I get it" moments should be our main focus. Celebrate the successes rather than focussing on the shortcomings. Jo Boaler is a British education author and is Professor of Mathematics Education at the Stanford Graduate School of Education. Boaler is involved in promoting mathematics education reform and equitable mathematics classrooms.





JO BOALER'S ADVICE FOR PARENTS.

Encourage children to play maths puzzles and games. Puzzles and games—anything with dice, really—will help kids enjoy maths and develop number sense, which is critically important.

Always be encouraging and never tell kids they are wrong when they are working on maths problems. Instead, find the logic in their thinking. For example, if your child multiplies 3 by 4 and gets 7, say, "Oh, I see what you are thinking. You are using what you know about addition to add 3 and 4. When we multiply, we have 4 groups of 3 ..."



Never associate maths with speed. It is not important to work quickly, and we now know that forcing kids to work quickly on maths is the best way to start maths anxiety for children, especially girls.



Never share with your children the idea that you were bad at maths at school or you dislike it— especially if you are a mother. Researchers found that as soon as mothers shared that idea with their daughters, their daughters' achievement went down.

Encourage number sense. What separates high and low achievers is having an idea of the size of numbers and being able to separate and combine numbers flexibly. For example, when solving 29+56, if you take one from the 56 and make it 30+55, it is much easier to work out.

Perhaps most important of all: Encourage a "growth mindset" to let students know that they have unlimited maths potential and that being good at maths is all about working hard. When they tell you something is hard for them or they have made a mistake, tell them, "That's wonderful—your brain is growing!"
